Meeting opened with Welcome by James Wood, followed by Pledge of Allegiance

<u>Treasurer Report</u>: bank balance of \$3379.40

Expenses: \$237.93 paid for Mats/

Chairs for the Honey Booth

\$305.82 paid for Honey Straws \$99 paid for expenses incurred making the website.

\$163.52 paid for expenses incurred doing the school programs

<u>Financial Report</u>: Deposit of \$40 – a donation from Binghampton Elementary School.

Next Meeting: Work Day at the Harford Fair. August 9th at 11 am. The club will provide Sloppy Joes and dishes\utensils. Bring a dish to pass, and your own drinks. This year is in the new building, so should be quick work to get it ready for the fair.

<u>Thank You</u>: SBA says "Thank You" to Joe and Arlene T for volunteering to bag the candy for the Harford Fair.

<u>Honey Straws</u>: sold out of honey straws last year, so bought 6 Thousand straws for this years fair. With the honey shortage, straws are hard to come by this year. If we do not sell out, any leftover straws will be available to club members for purchase.

Mentor Program: Still looking for volunteers to mentor new members and a coordinator for the program.

Nominating committee: Dick Chapin to replace Dave Taylor on the Committee

<u>Club Requests</u>: received request from Troy Fair to run a program there. Request tabled until next year due to need for more information. Dave Taylor to get more information, such as: do they want an informational display only or do they want honey sales too, do we have enough honey \manpower to run another booth.

Kathy Swepston donated posters for the new Honey Booth at the the fair. Club voted to accept them, and the decision was made to frame them so they stay cleaner. Kathy also suggested having a sandwich board in front with possible title of "How I use my Honey" that people can write down their own uses\suggestions. Aubrey offer the use of his Sandwich board and paper.

<u>Fair Handout</u>: It is getting costly and time consuming for Ginny to print out the Brochures for the fair. Question was asked about getting them printed professionally. Aubrey offered use of printing and folding machine, if he can get an electronic copy.




THANK YOU


